

# MAYROSE WILL PLAY GRANATS FOR THE TITLE

Camozzi Southpaws Team Into Chance for Championship of Seals' League

Camozzi, a left-hander, started for Mayrose and stayed five innings only because none of the Granat boys were wide awake enough to note that he was no where near the rubber when he was pitching. He was closer to third base most of the time when he was throwing.

But then neither the umpires nor the players take note of these little things in the winter time.

**Chicken Hawks Makes Three Plays That Stop Trouble**  
Chicken Hawks turned in three plays that prevented Mayrose from being beaten by a bigger score. Twice he snared ground balls and threw runners out at the plate and another time he charged in and got a thrower that bounded away from Johnny Kerr and out a runner, doing that when he was trying to take a extra base on the bad throw. That kind of work caught the eye of Bill Lane, who was quite a center fielder himself a couple of decades ago.

Camozzi got a big hand when he raced over to the stand and caught a high foul, when neither the catcher or the first baseman could get near it. Camozzi had a big day and looked like a pitch pitcher.

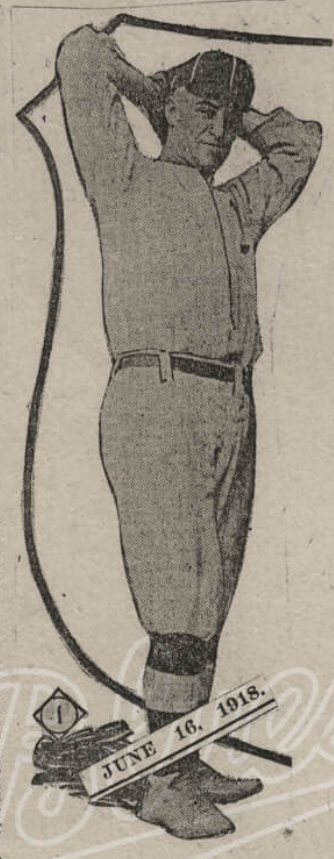
Another big crowd was out to see the boys in action, the attendance being placed in the neighborhood of 4,000.
