San Mateo Takes Measure of San Jose Nine by 5 to 3 Score

MODESTO, April 22.—Although the Modesto Reds outlit the San Francisco Stock Exchange baseball club in the second game of the California State League here this afternoon they were unable to hit when the hits were needed and were decisively defeated by the score of 9 to 4.

Ted Shirley, Reds' pitching ace, was knocked out of the box in the seventh and relieved by Scharr, Modesto's latest addition to its pitching staff. Scharr allowed but two hits in the two and a half innings in which he worked and accepted three chances.

The Reds sent Mickey Shader to the clubhouse in the seventh inning also. He was relieved by Conroy, who was touched for four hits and a run.
